We are committed to the Church's mission in education, with spiritual and moral development a priority. The Full Governing Body meets four times a year to review progress against the School Improvement Plan.

- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

## Strategic Direction and School Improvement Plan

Setting the strategic direction of the school is a vital role of governors. They support the Headteacher and senior leadership team in setting the school's priorities and strategic direction.

Governors monitor the School Improvement Plan (SIP). They receive reports from the Head Teacher relating to the SIP and monitor the progress towards achieving targets and goals.

At the end of the academic year 2023/24 the SDP was reviewed and further actions identified.

Governors have approved the SDP for this coming year and its key areas for improvement across the school and it can be viewed on the school website.

## Policies

Governors review all relevant policies, during the relevant committee meeting, on a programmed basis to ensure that they meet the statutory requirements and that all guidance is relevant and up to date. All policies, which are dated and set for review, are available on the school website and on Trust Governor.

## Training

New Governors are expected to attend Diocesan training for new Governors. Governors are encouraged to attend any training that is relevant to the SDP in the first instance. Governors may also attend any training that is of particular interest to them. All Governors attended training in the Equality Act All Governors have completed prevent training, which will be refreshed in Autumn 2024

All Governors have completed prevent training, which will be refreshed in Autumn 20 Governors will attend basic awareness training in November 2024.

### Actions this year:

- In September 2023, Kirsty Guite became the Chair of Governors and has been supported by Sean Callaghan as Vice Chair.
- Sean Callaghan became a Foundation Governor replacing Louisa Joyce. Ruth Browne was reelected as staff governor. Lisa Jones was re-appointed as Foundation governor.
- We thank Louisa for her time as SEND governor during which her knowledge had an impact on provision and outcomes for SEND pupils
- Kirsty was present at each budget meeting and ensured that the budget was balanced at that decisions were made with the children at the centre
- Governors met with Mark Mountcastle CEO of the Our Lady Help of Christians MAT. After much deliberation, governors decided to start the conversion process.
- The Governing Body is supported by a clerk from One Education.
- Link governor visits were made by the governor with responsibility for safeguarding to support with a parent who was banned from site and a LADO referral; the PE governor, RE governor and Equality governor. The link governor for health and safety made a site visit and identified actions.
- The chair supported with a complaint and a parent who was banned from site.
- All Governors sign the CES Code of Conduct
- Governors have been focussed on the wellbeing of staff. They ensure that staff are well supported and as a result staff are motivated.

Holding Head teacher to account

- Robust headteacher performance review alongside an external partner
- Acting as a critical friend when reviewing policies, finances, the SDP or staffing
- Pupil attendance figures are reported at each meeting. The Governors continue to set challenging pupil attendance targets and analyse trends in detail at FGB meetings
