ICT - One Page Policy

Non-negotiables

ICT will be taught following the Kapow units of learning. Teachers will ensure computing is reinforced in other areas of the curriculum, for example, by drawing parallels with the Kapow Bletchley Park and the studies of WW2 in History in year six.

Scheme

Computing will be taught following the Kapow units of work and progression framework. It will be taught periodically, with four units to be completed across each academic year.

Assessment

Teachers should plan in opportunities for informal assessment as well as at the end of a unit. Bookwidget vocabulary cards provided should be revised to monitor understanding at intervals across the unit.

Teachers are advised to use the sticky knowledge statements as a guide for assessment.

Saving pupils' work

All the childrens' work will be saved to student shared and this will support our assessment.

All work is to be saved on the student shared server in the relevant year group folder.

Display

Each class has a space allocated on the whole school Computing board to display any examples of individual or group work from lessons based on that half-term's unit. Pupils must be comfortable with their work being displayed.
