Collective Worship in the Life of Our School

We believe that Christian worship in a Catholic school is concerned with giving glory, honour, praise and thanks to God. It is our loving response, in word and action to God's invitation to enter into relationship, made possible through the work of Jesus Christ and the witness of the Holy Spirit.

Worship in this school is more than just a legal requirement. It is an integral part of school life and central to the Catholic tradition. Collective worship takes into account the religious and educational needs of all who share in it:

- Those who form part of the worshipping community in church;
- Those for whom school may be their first and only experience of church;
- Those from other Christian traditions;
- Those from other faith backgrounds or no faith background;
- It will be an educational activity or experience to which all can contribute and from which all can gain.

The Aims of Collective Worship

We believe that Collective Worship in our school aims to provide opportunity for all pupils and staff:

- To contemplate something of the mystery of God
- To reflect on spiritual and moral issues
- To explore their own beliefs
- To respond to and celebrate life
- To experience a sense of belonging and develop community spirit
- To develop a common ethos and shared values
- To enrich religious experience
- To grow in liturgical understanding and development
- To reinforce prayers that are part of the Catholic tradition
- To reinforce positive attitudes
- To participate fully
- To make time to 'wonder at', 'to come to terms with' and 'to give worth to'

Principles

All acts of Worship in this school will:

- Give glory and honour to God
- Be a quality activity fundamental to the life of the school and its Catholic Character
- Give children positive liturgical experiences appropriate to their age, aptitude and family backgrounds in order to prepare them for the liturgical life of the Church.

In order to do this, celebrations will:

- Be kept small wherever possible or appropriate to personalise the experience
- Be short and appropriately paced
- Be simple, including a range of experiences offered in a variety of groupings and in a variety of settings.

<u>Planning</u>

Collective Worship in this school is planned following a structure with reference to the Church's seasons, Ten Ten resources, The Way the Truth the Life, the Shrewsbury diocese resources, significant dates (Appendix 2) and the RE Curriculum Directory.

- Scripture will be the focus for most acts of worship
- It will relate to the school community in the light of the school's aims and Mission
- There will be flexibility to respond to changing situations within the school and the wider community
- We will aim to teach children the skills to enable them to prepare, organise and lead worship



Monitoring and Evaluation

Throughout the year, as part of the school's monitoring calendar, the school's provision of worship will be evaluated to consider whether it meets the needs of pupils and whether it truly reflects the aims and mission of the school.

Resources

There are many resources available for planning Collective Worship. These are stored centrally in the cupboard outside the staffroom and are reviewed regularly as part of the RE Lead's monitoring role. There are several Internet sites that are also a useful resource for planning.

Timetable

In order to achieve the above, Collective Worship is organised as follows:

Monday – Whole school assembly centred around Gospel readings using Ten Ten resources and led by class teachers **Tuesday** – Class collective worship using Ten Ten resources

Wednesday – Whole school assembly centred around Gospel readings and led by SLT.

Thursday – Class collective worship prepared using Shrewsbury diocese resources - Y2-Y6 children to plan and lead.

Friday – Whole School Assembly led by Mrs McGuire, including school news and attendance awards.

Attending Mass

Mass is an integral part of worship at St Benedict's and takes place in church at least once per half term. Mass in school will highlight a special occasion and will usually be led by the children. When preparing these celebrations, reference will be made to the 'Directory for Masses with Children' as a basis for our practice. In addition to our half termly whole school masses, Key Stage 2 classes attend mass weekly and this is done on a rota.

Children will be encouraged to participate in Sunday Masses throughout the year. Children will be prepared for the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation, usually during Y3. Special Sunday Masses are arranged with Catechists and the Parish Priest for the children to participate in.

Leader of Collective Worship

The RE Lead leads all areas of R.E. including collective worship. They will work in partnership with the Parish Priest and the Headteacher to make sure that all collective worship is both Catholic in organisation and content. They inform and enable all members of staff and the children to fully engage in following the Catholic faith.
